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<u>ANNEX I</u>

Internal Market Information System (IMI)

The European Union, in order to facilitate the professional activities of its citizens in other Member States, has enacted three relevant Directives, concerning: (a) the recognition of professional qualifications (Directive 2005/36/EC), (b) the provision of Services (Directive 2006/123/EC) and (c) the application of patients' rights in cross-border healthcare (Directive 2011/24/EU). The provisions of these Directives have been transposed into national legislation with the enactment of the corresponding pertinent laws: (a) on the Recognition of Professional Qualifications Law of 2008 (L. 31(I)/2008), (b) on the Freedom of Establishment of Service Providers and the Free Movement of Services Law of 2010 (L. 76(I)/2010) and (c) on the Application of Patients' Rights in Cross -Border Healthcare Law of 2013 (L.149(I)/2013).

Within the scope of applying these Directives, the European Commission has developed an electronic tool/system for the exchange of information, the Internal Market Information System (IMI).

The IMI System is intended to support the administrative cooperation and simplification of procedures required for practicing professionals and active service providers in other member states in the European Union (EE) and the European Economic Area (EEA). Only Authorities that have competence in relation to the recognition of professional qualifications and the provision of services have access to the IMI system. The system provides the Authorities with the ability of exchanging information through standardized questions, for professionals and providers of services who wish to be active in another Member State.

The Competent Authority of a Member State that accepts applications for registration in its Register from professionals and service providers who are registered with corresponding Authorities of other Member States, may, through the system, find the corresponding Authorities and, by using the standard queries provided by the system, collect information concerning the applicants, which are relevant to the subject matter of their application.

The IMI System includes, *inter alia*, an "Alert mechanism" providing the competent authorities with the ability to notify the authorities of other member states of every activity which might cause serious damage to the health or safety of persons or to the environment and a "Notifications mechanism" which notifies the competent authorities in cases where professionals are subject to sanctions or restriction penalties or prohibition of exercising their profession.

The Coordinators of the IMI System may also act as Competent Authorities and as such may send or receive requests for information. Furthermore, the "Incoming Alert Post box" Coordinator and the Alert Coordinators may notify the authorities of other member states as to the provision of services which may cause serious damage to the health or safety of persons or to the environment through the "alert mechanism".

<u>ANNEX II</u>

Within the scope of Directives 2005/36/EC and 2006/123/EC and the harmonising legislation (Law 31(I)/2008 and Law 76(I)/2010), respectively, the Council, in order to simplify the procedures and the administrative cooperation required to examine an application of a member for registration may, through the IMI System, request and receive information from the Competent Authority of another Member State concerning the applicant, in which the applicant has stated he is a registered member.

The Coordinators for the IMI System may also act as Competent Authorities and as such may send or receive requests for information.

ANNEX III

You are hereby informed that where a person registered in the Register retained by the Council submits an application for registration in a Register of a Competent Authority of another Member State in the EE or the EEA., the Council, in order to simplify the procedures and the administrative cooperation required to examine the application of a member for registration, if requested, may, through the IMI System, provide the Competent Authority of the receiving Member State, with information concerning the applicant, relevant to the subject matter of his application for registration.

The Coordinators of the IMI System may also act as Competent Authorities and as such may send or receive requests for information.

Under section 30 of Law 76(I)/2010 the Council may notify the competent authorities of other Member States with regard to any service activities that might cause serious damage to the health or safety of persons or to the environment, through the "Alert Mechanism" provided in the IMI System.
